



# the Dino Trail

## **1 Bynum** 1-800-238-6873

Visitors to the Two Medicine Dinosaur Center will see the world's largest full-size skeletal model of Seismosaurus, which checks in at 137-feet-long and 23-feet-tall. The center also includes the first baby dino bones ever found in North America.

## **2 Choteau** 406-466-5332

The Old Trail Museum includes educational adventures that provide dino instruction, geology and archeology along the Rocky Mountain Front, including the famed Egg Mountain dig site. Open seasonally.

## **3 Bozeman** 406-994-DINO

The Museum of the Rockies, the state's flagship dino station, is undergoing a 10,000 square-foot expansion that will make it one of the world's premier dino museums. It already covers much of the state's dino chronology.

## **4 Rudyard** 406-355-4383

The Depot Museum is expected to open this summer and will include a duck-bill dinosaur and other specimens on loan from the Museum of the Rockies in Bozeman.

## **5 Harlowton** 406-632-5519

The Upper Musselshell Museum includes a full size replica skeleton of an Avaceratops, the first dino ever found of its kind. Other specimens include giant jaws, leg bones and fossilized shells.

## **6 Havre** 406-265-4000

The Earl Clack Memorial Museum includes 75-million year-old dino eggs and embryos laid by a duck-bill dinosaur.

## **7 Malta** 406-654-5300

The Dinosaur Field Station, home of the Judith River Dinosaur Institute, oversees the station's exploration and excavation program. A host of famous dinosaur finds are under preparation here including a mummified dinosaur and a Stegosaurus. Open by appointment only.

## **8 Malta** 406-654-1037

The Phillips County Museum features fossils found in the nearby Judith River Formation including the 33-foot long skeleton of a Brachylophosaurus, one of the best-articulated dinosaur skeletons ever found.

## **9 Fort Peck** 406-526-3493

The Fort Peck Interpretive Center and Museum may be the gem of the Hi Line. The museum opened in 2004 and includes one of the most complete T-rex skeletons ever found. Admission is free and the museum is open year round.

## **10 Fort Peck** 406-526-3539

The Paleontology and Dinosaur Field Station is a working base of paleontologists, allowing for the research, preparation, molding and casting of fossil finds. It's open by special appointment.

## **11 Jordan** 406-557-2517

The Garfield County Museum includes a T-rex head and a complete replica of Triceratops. The first T-rex ever discovered was found in 1902 nearby.

## **12 Glendive** 406-377-1637

Makoshika State Park is part of the famed Hell Creek Formation that has yielded 10 different dinosaur species including Triceratops, T-rex and Edmontosaurus. The park's museum offers various dino attractions.

## **13 Ekalaka** 406-775-6886

The Carter County Museum includes the skeleton of a very rare Anatotitan, and the skulls of a Triceratops, a "Dome Head" dinosaur, and a "tiny Tyrannosaur." All specimens were collected nearby. Admission is free and the museum is open year-round.
